WHAT IS LIVING IN 2 WORLDS?

The **Living in 2 Worlds** Summer Day Camp is open to middle school-aged students who will be entering the 6th grade up to entering the 9th grade. The **L2W** Summer Day Camp will begin Monday, June 3rd and end Thursday, June 27th. It will take place four days per week (Monday through Thursday) from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. Students can arrive as early as 7:30 and picked up no later than 5:30 pm. Breakfast will be offered from 7:30 to 8:30 am. Participating youth will be fed through the Phoenix Indian Center, or they can provide their own lunch.

The **Living in 2 Worlds** curriculum was developed by the Phoenix Indian Center in partnership with ASU's Southwest Interdisciplinary Research Center using the **Keepin' it REAL** drug resistance strategies project as a program for our American Indian youth. **Living in 2 Worlds** draws on American Indian culture and values as effective drug resistance strategies. We provide youth with different ways to say no to negative choices that confront youth every day, and at the same time, we give youth ample opportunity to express their pride in their American Indian culture(s) and teach them the positive value in the nurturing of that pride.

TRANSPORTATION

Participants will be dropped off/picked up at the Day Camp by a parent/legal guardian or other responsible adult. People who are permitted to pick up a participant should be listed in the PERSONS AUTHORIZED FOR STUDENT PICK UP section of this application. Participants will not be released to anyone who has not been given authorization by parent/guardian.

Students may also get to and from Camp via walking and/or public transportation with parent/guardian permission. Please, let us know how your child will get to and from **Living in 2 Worlds** Summer Day Camp.

- I or another responsible adult will transport my child to and from Camp. Anyone other than the child's parent/guardian must be listed in the section titled PERSONS AUTHORIZED FOR STUDENT PICK UP of this form.
- My child will walk/use public transportation to and from Camp. (Please discuss details with staff beforehand.)

Parents that are late picking up their child may run the risk of staff calling the police department or DES.

I have checked the appropriate box (page 2) and/or have listed the names and contact information of all adults authorized to transport my child (page 1).</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Meals: Breakfast will be available for participants between the times of 7:30 am and 8:30 am. Phoenix Indian Center will provide lunch for participants. Participants may also bring their own healthy lunch.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Pre- and Post-Program Surveys: The survey will gather information on attitudes, thoughts, and behaviors around use of substances, such as alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. A copy of the actual surveys used to evaluate this program can be provided to you upon request.</p> <p>Your child(ren)'s participation in the evaluation is voluntary. Students who are given permission to participate only have to answer the questions they want to answer, and they may stop taking the survey at any time. Refusal to participate in the evaluation survey involves no penalty, and your child will still be permitted to participate in the program.</p> <p>All personal information collected in the surveys will be kept private. The only place in which your child's name will appear will be on this registration form, and names of individual students will never be shared with anyone not affiliated with Living in 2 Worlds Day Camp or Phoenix Indian Center. The results from these surveys help to improve the curriculum and program.</p>

Student should show up on-time for all scheduled activities, events, and classes. • Communication. Student should inform staff of contact information changes, as well as concerns related to the program or activities; e.g. transportation, housing, personal issues, etc. • Responsibility. Student agrees to abide by all rules and standards, established by the Phoenix Indian Center Inc. (e.g. no smoking in the building, inappropriate language, improper use of equipment, no drugs, alcohol, and firearms allowed on the premises.)
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Daily Drop Off / Dismissal Procedure:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 7:30 to 8:30 am – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students arrive. Those students who are transported by Parents/Guardian will be dropped off at designated drop-off/pick-up spot to be communicated with Parents/Guardian and students no later than the start of the first day of Camp. All Parents/Guardian can either walk their child in or drop them off (staff will be waiting outside between 7:30 -8:30 am. Parents/Guardian must sign daily at drop off. Drop off must occur on the North side of the building (650 N. 2nd Avenue Phoenix, AZ 85003). ○ Breakfast available for those students arriving between 7:30-8:30am. • 8:30 am – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Start of Day. • 4:25 pm – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Parents/Guardian must come inside (enter on the north side of the building) to pick up your child. Parents/Guardian must sign your child in and out daily. • 5:15 pm – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Calls will be made to Parents/Guardians of all students who have not been picked up by 5:15pm. All students must be picked up no later than 5:30 pm.

I understand the activities are voluntary, and I agree to accept the responsibility for my child's personal safety and participation in the program. I consent to the provision of emergency medical treatment for my child to the extent the treatment is necessary in the medical opinion of the doctor rendering the treatment. If I have any concerns about my child's ability to participate in any event or activity associated with the Phoenix Indian Center. I agree to discuss my concerns with my child's physician before signing this form.

This agreement will remain in effect for the duration of the program. The Phoenix Indian Center personnel will be advised of any violations of agreement and appropriate action may be taken to remedy the situation, including family discussions or possible suspension or termination from the program.
