#### Review Meeting Minutes from August 27, 2024.

# **Organization Spotlight Series**

## notMYkid presented by Danielle Flowers

Summary – This presentation provided an overview of the services and impact of the nonprofit organization, notMYkid, founded in 2000. NotMYkid seeks to provide support and resources for youth, their mental health, and wellbeing. Within their 24 years of experience, notMYkid has directly serviced over 3 million youth and adults. The 3 major programs that are offered include behavioral health, peer programs, and prevention education for ages 13-24. In the year 2023-2024, notMYkid was able to directly serve 40,216 youth and 6,458 adults and distributed 200 Narcan kits and 250 prescription lockboxes. The Behavioral Health program focuses on licensed therapists that offer family & individual counseling, therapy & skill-based groups, and intensive outpatient services. A popular piece of programming includes Project Rewind, an early action solution for teens and their families that includes two 2-hour group classes and 1-hour individual session. ## City of Phoenix presented by Rachel Sodhi

Summary – This presentation gave an overview of the emerging substance use needs for Phoenix. The presentation provided much needed context of the city, the Office of Public Health, and a summary of the data collected by the city of Phoenix regarding overdoses and the equitable distribution of resources across the county. The city recently launched an open-data dashboard that tracks overdoses, overdose deaths, and EMS calls responding to suspected overdoses. The 2025-2030 substance use strategic plan goals include:

- Prevent substance use-related deaths & disease.
- Reduce barriers to treatment and recovery.
- Prevent youth substance use and addiction.
- Strengthen city of Phoenix behavioral health crises responses.
- Reduce stigma associated with substance use disorder.
- Increase coordination & collaborative partnership.
- Invest in data monitoring & program evaluation.
- Understand and influence the policy landscape.

## GCAHR Project HF2W/P2W

• Loren B. reported out - Informational sessions for the GCAHR research study will be taking place on September 24<sup>th</sup>, October 1<sup>st</sup>, and October 10<sup>th</sup>. The first lesson for the newest cycle will be taking place on October 15<sup>th</sup> at the Phoenix Indian Center. This study is for caregivers of American Indian and Alaska Native youth ages 12-17.

 Cristian C. reported - Safeguarding Medications 101 lunch and learn workshops will be taking place on October 2<sup>nd</sup>, October 24<sup>th</sup> from 12pm-1pm.

## Drug Take Back Day (DTBD)

• Ethan T. reported - On October 26<sup>th</sup>, the coalition is hosting a Drug Takeback Day at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center. This event is for community members to bring expired or unused medications to be properly disposed of.

# **QPR Gatekeeper Training**

 Perise L. reported out – The coalition will be providing a private QPR training on October 3<sup>rd</sup> and the downtown ASU campus for the American Indian Social Work Student Association, and for those in the ASU community.

## safeTALK

• Perise L. reported out – A September safeTALK was rescheduled for October 8th, with the location to be announced soon.





## Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)

 Belen S. reported out – The coalition will be conducting a private training for the Chandler Unified School District on Ober 10-11th. This is a 2-day suicide prevention training.

## **Network Support Roundtable**

 Cante Z. reported out – We will be hosting a Network Support Roundtable in-person at the Phoenix Indian Center on October 1st. This event is for those who work in suicide prevention and/or have been trained in safeTALK, QPR, and ASIST. Those who attend will also receive a selfcare kit.

#### **FINAL Youth Coalition**

Cante Z. reported out – The Phoenix Indian Center recently inaugurated the 2024-2025 FINAL
Youth Council, with 38 youth making up the council. Those within the Prevention committee are
identified as being part of the Youth Coalition and will be working on Prevention projects for the
next school year.

Appreciation Breakfast happening on October 24th, and the ICWA Symposium taking place in

## **#AMileFor Campaign & Community Walk**

• Belen S. reported out - #AMileFor is a suicide prevention and awareness campaign developed by the Suicide Prevention Subcommittee in 2023 as an annual project to honor those who have been lost to suicide, those who are currently struggling, and to raise awareness by walking a mile. Thie campaign is customizable, with community members being able to walk for anyone they choose. The walk route will be 1 mile, from the street of Indian School Road to Osborn, and back up to the Phoenix Indian Center.
